### **Improvement Plans:**

- The Dry Sprinkler System Upgrade Phase 2 will be completed soon. There have been a few challenges of access to the space in the Eventide Wing (Dining Area - Chapel) It is necessary to block off (hoard) certain areas in that area as pipes are installed. A solid plan is in place to avoid significant interruption or inconvenience.
- We are very pleased that funding has been received for 15 new beds. Over the next few years, we would like to replace many more.
